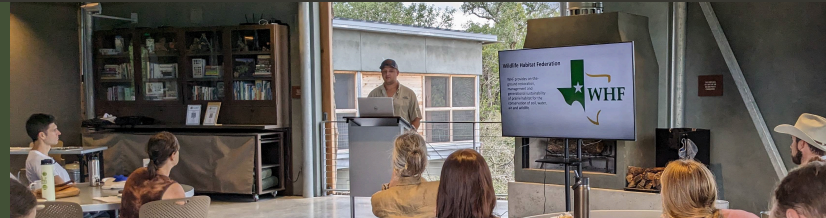


2023 Impact Report

2023 Milestones

USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) cooperative agreement secured to support NRCS Field Office capacity, bringing \$1.7M in conservation planning services to landowners in more than 130 counties over a three-year period, placing 60,000+ acres under improved management.

National Fish and Wildlife Foundation's America the Beautiful Challenge grant awarded establishing a three-year \$595,000 project to assist in the development and/or management of Monarch Butterfly and Northern Bobwhite Quail habitat across a 17-county area of the Upper Texas Mid-Coast.

Ongoing alliance with the Coastal Prairie Conservancy continues with habitat management planning and implementation through the Texas Coastal Prairie Initiative.



8,736 acres under improved management resulted in:

8,736 pounds of carbon sequestered



1,714 pounds of nitrogen fixed in improved soils



125 pounds of phosphorus values held at optimal levels

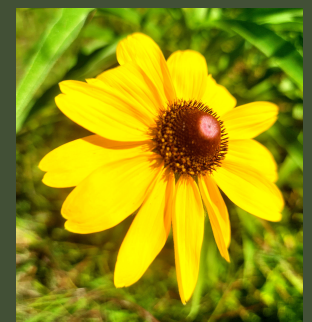
